



Rio Vista Natural Resource Park

Located at the north end of Tucson Boulevard, Rio Vista Park is situated on the former ranch site of Charles Bagley. It is a popular horse area and offers access onto the Rillito River Park. Dedicated in 2005, Rio Vista is a 40-acre natural resource park with pathways for bicyclists and pedestrians separated from equestrian use paths. This is a great place to park your car and go walking along the Rillito River. Visitors are asked not to feed any desert wildlife and to respect the wildlife population, which includes different bird varieties, lizards, and occasional bobcats and coyotes.

Features: Natural desert areas, green turf area, equestrian staging area, playground, ramadas, picnic tables, restrooms, and an amphitheater with shade structure and sitting wall to view the Catalina Mountains. There is a small public gathering spot with a neighborhood bulletin board and wildlife education signs.
